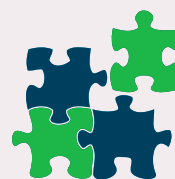

PROGRAMS AND QUALIFICATIONS TAILORED TO STUDENT INTEREST

Completing Year 12 is essential for a young person's social, personal and career development. As such, the foundation of our programs is a Senior Secondary Certificate. Students in the NT achieve this by completing school subjects from the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET).

SEDA students undertake a combination of mainstream and Vocational Education and Training (VET) qualifications, which develop their industry-specific skills and contribute credits towards their Senior Secondary Certificate.

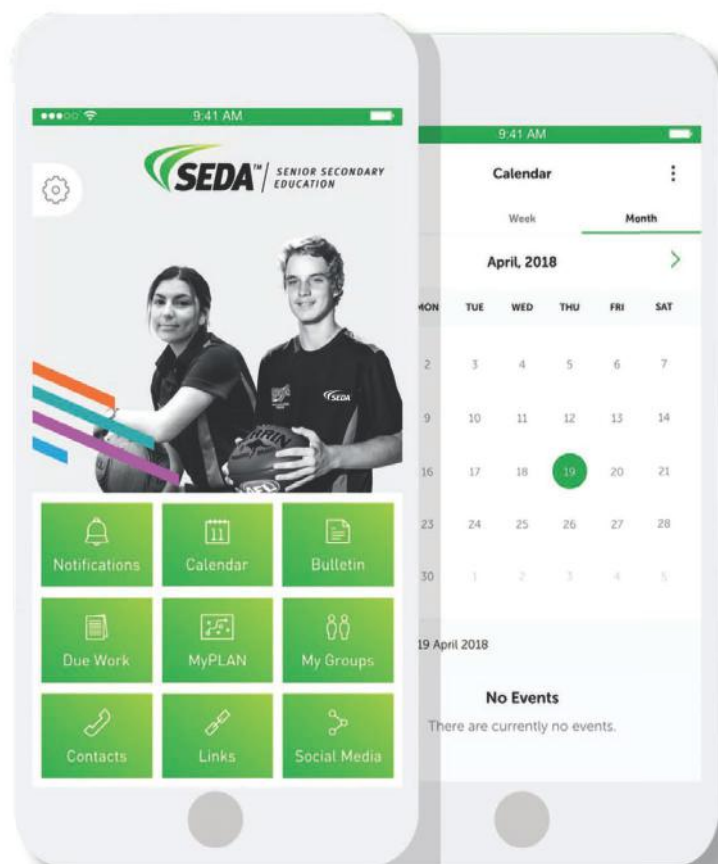

We connect with leading sport, recreation and community organisations in Australia, giving students unique opportunities and experiences that meet the needs of the modern-day workplace.

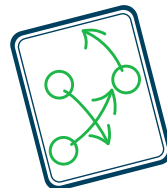

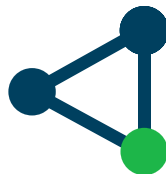

AREAS OF STUDY

OUR CURRICULUM IS DESIGNED TO TEACH YOU THE SKILLS REQUIRED TO EXCEL IN A JOB ACROSS A NUMBER OF INDUSTRIES.

Our programs offer a range of study areas that are specific to students' passion for sport and are focused on developing skills for life after SEDA.

THE ATHLETE

Engage with our sporting partners and access their knowledge to implement concepts related to athlete training and development. You will learn from your own practical experiences about fitness testing, data analysis, anatomy/physiology, energy systems, training principles, nutrition and sport specific training. You will also explore all aspects of team performance and discover the physical and mental dynamics of training a team or group. Design training programs targeted to improve team performance and participate in regular gym and fitness sessions at professional fitness facilities.

THE APPRENTICE/MYPLAN

Start with a plan and you are on track to create success for yourself. Through MyPLAN meetings, the work that you do in The Apprentice and on your structured work placement, you will explore career pathways in real workplace settings and acquire transferrable skills that employers' value. The SEDA Program will also give you the opportunity to work at high profile sport and recreational events through our volunteering programs. Explore the value of volunteering, while building your resume and connecting with key professionals in your chosen industry. Our teaching staff and Pathways Team members guide you for the entire length of the program.

HEALTHY LIVING

Designed to develop a better you, SEDA aims to develop your physical and mental wellbeing to cope with the things that life

throws at you. In Healthy Living you will investigate respectful relationships, driver education and safe partying to better equip yourself to deal with the types of situations that arise when you are out and about with friends and family.

THE POWER OF SPORT

Understand the influence of sport in the community and how it can shape culture and behaviour. Learn and experience how sport can break down barriers and bring people together. Link with community groups to organise and run community projects and activities. You will work in groups, developing your collaborative, problem solving and teamwork skills as you put your ideas into action.

WORK PLACEMENTS THAT PAY OFF IN THE FUTURE

Our students get a head start in their careers through our structured Work Placement. This hands-on learning experience is delivered one day a week. Students gain an in-depth understanding of the duties they might be expected to perform in the workplace, and they will acquire the skills that prospective employers need and want in their employees.

VET QUALIFICATIONS (THE COACH)

Develop the skills and attributes needed to teach sport skills to a wide variety of people. Access SEDA's industry experts and sporting partners to gain a greater understanding of coaching principles and the development of coaching sessions.

Students undertake a full SIS20115 Certificate II in Sport and Recreation, SIS30115 Certificate III in Sport and Recreation and SIS40115 Certificate IV in Sport and Recreation providing them with the opportunity to gain industry experience in a variety of areas relating to Sport and Recreation.

SAMPLE STUDENT TIMETABLE

Students attend SEDA five days a week, completing a timetable that will look similar to the one shown below. The timetable below is subject to change.

Up to three days a week, students complete the classroom-based component of their qualifications. The other two days of the week focus on practical, and industry-based learning activities. This allows students to work towards completion of their senior secondary certificate, as well as vocational units of competency.

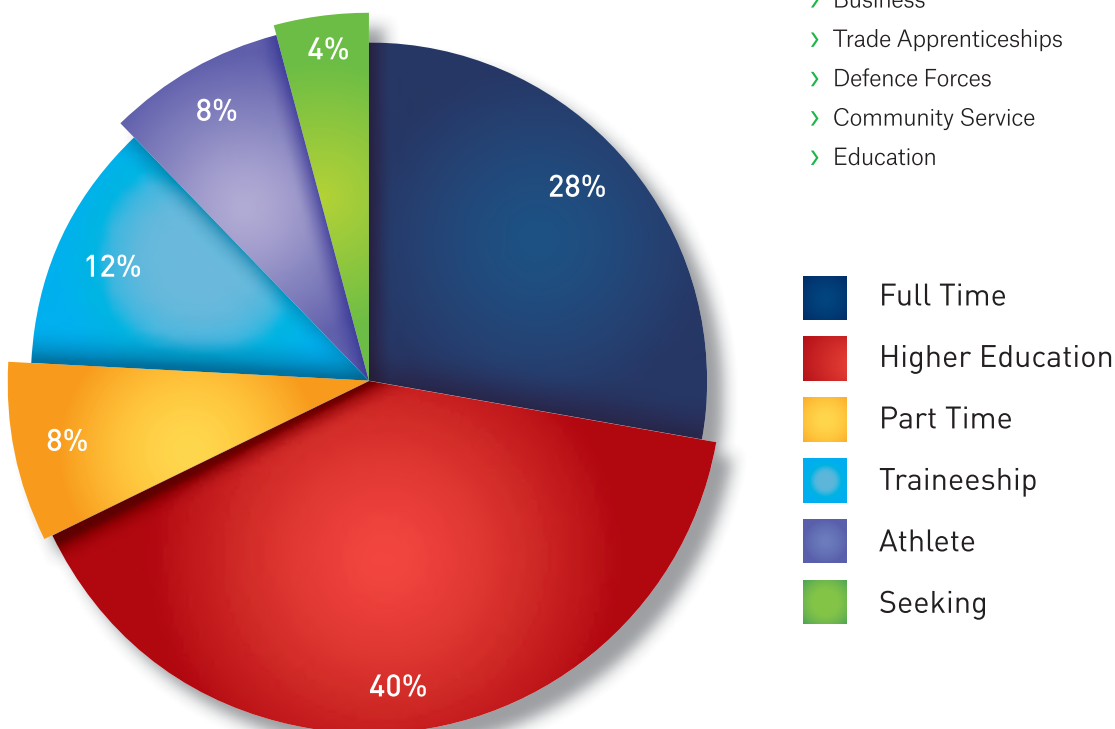

YOUR FUTURE

SEDA students undertake VET units and qualifications, which contribute to their Senior Secondary Certificate and develop their industry specific credentials, allowing them to transition into work or further study. With a strong connection to industry, students develop initiative, communication, leadership, resilience and critical thinking skills. This provides SEDA graduates with the opportunity to gain employment across numerous industries.

SPORTS INDUSTRY PROGRAM

SEDA graduates have the opportunity to continue building strong industry connections through the SEDA Group's Sports Industry Program. The Dual Diploma program comprising the SIS50612 Diploma of Sport Development and the BSB50215 Diploma of Business will give you the opportunity to study in a practical learning environment and gain real experience working with your chosen industry partner. Our partnerships with national and state sporting organisations, elite clubs and leading industry service providers will enable you to be connected to and learn from highly experienced people in the industry.

The VET Student Loan program is available for this SIS50612 Diploma of Sport Development. A VET Student Loan will not be approved for students who do not meet eligibility requirements. In 2019, the maximum course fee is \$11,249.60. A VET Student Loan gives rise to a HELP debt that continues to be debt due to the Commonwealth until it is repaid. SEDA NATIONAL INDIGENOUS EDUCATION AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

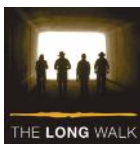
During AFL Dreamtime week in 2018, SEDA Group (SEDA), The Long Walk and Essendon Football Club officially launched the SEDA National Indigenous Education and Leadership Program. The program is supported by a number of other Indigenous organisations including Tiwi College, Tiwi Islands Training and Employment Board (TITEB), MADALAH and AIME.

The focus of the National Indigenous Education and Leadership Program is to work closely with our industry, education and community partners to educate and empower our Indigenous students and assist them to realise their potential. A key aspect of the program is to develop the next generation of young Indigenous leaders and role models and create strong pathways for our students into higher education and/or employment. Strengthening cultural identity is a core component of the program.

Indigenous students from the NT will come together as a group a number of times throughout the year. Subject to funding, students may also have the opportunity to attend a SEDA national leadership camp that will bring together SEDA Indigenous students from around Australia.
